At present, this classroom is set up conference style. While it is used for lectures and meetings, it is more frequently used for classes that where students regularly break-out into smaller groups for active and collaborative learning sessions for which the current set-up is not suitable. See the attached Excel spreadsheet for room bookings for 2014-2015.

The requested SMART board which will be installed at the front of the classroom, and the white boards which will be installed on the side walls, will support active and collaborative learning, interactive and group activities and a task-based teaching approach which are all leading-edge pedagogical techniques used in humanities and social science classes and for language teaching. This interactive approach to learning is actively encouraged and promoted by the University.

The coat hooks will ensure that coats and knapsacks/book bags are not strewn about the floor posing hazards as students move between groups.
