



Motion to Amend the Arts Internship Office Advisory Committee By-Laws

Whereas, the Arts Internship Office Advisory Committee (AIOAC) was struck as both an avenue for more direct collaboration with the AUS and also as a method for influence over the direction of the AIO given their sustaining fee paid by arts students;

Whereas, the VP Finance has not sat on the AIOAC for the past two years;

Whereas, directing concerns of conflict of interest to the VP Academic does not address the possibility of the VP Academic incurring a conflict of interest;

Whereas, the presentations of the AIO do not change drastically between the Fall and Winter and would not be the most effective use of councilors' time;

Whereas, these by-law revisions have the support of the Dean of Arts and were screened by the Constitutional By-Law Review Committee (CBRC);

Be it resolved, that AUS Legislative Council approve the following amendments to the AIOAC by-laws, as outlined in the appendix, effective immediately.
